

January 8 started the 2018 "short" legislative session. Coming so soon from the very "long" session in 2017 with three special sessions, legislators seem to be committed to keeping this session to the regularly scheduled 60 days. As with anything in the legislature, time will tell.

Last year in the budget and in <u>HB 2242</u>, CTE saw some significant changes to both policy and funding for our CTE programs. In total that should be seen as a big win politically for CTE within all of the K-12 funding increases.

Knowing that and understanding how all that was done will play-out in the day-to-day operations of CTE in our various school districts is yet to be fully known at this point. We do know from many of your conversations and comments that with respect to claiming students for funding with minimum instructional hours it is estimated that there will be a reduction of claimable FTE for CTE going forward.

The Washington ACTE with the help of the Legislative Committee, WACTA officers, and OSPI along with many voices from our affiliated sections have prepared a document to briefly outline the issue and our position that this was not the intention of the legislature and we are seeking their help for a solution within the funding formula to prevent the loss. We believe a solution can be created that should not require additional state funds, thus making a solution much more palatable to the legislature.

2018 CTE and Skill Center Funding

There are many policy bills trying to support student access and success in CTE reaching from "de-linking" state tests from graduation requirements, the State Board of Education passed a formal resolution last week to support de-linking, to increasing and standardizing CTE course equivalencies. Please check out the list of bills for more.

Good news...we are not alone in this work! The coalition of partners that have come together over the past few years continue to raise Career and Technical Education within their legislative priorities in 2018 and beyond. Not the least of which is the AWB's updated <u>Education and Workforce Training Legislative</u> <u>Objective</u>. Work Based Learning and career connected learning, which has a long history and grounding in CTE, is receiving more and more attention from our partners.
