Monday marks the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 60-day session. While this is scheduled as a “short” session the volume of bills carried over from 2017 and new introductions is the opposite of “short” generating a very fast pace for members and staff. A key component of that hectic pace is the continued focus on “sorting out” completing of the policy and funding effect(s) of [HB 2242](#) passed at the end of the third special session last year.

In an effort to help you understand the depth of what [HB 2242](#) addressed and how our education partners are responding to the changes I am sharing “WSSDA’s *Legislative Update for Week 2 of the 2018 Legislative Session (January 15 - 21)* is [now available here!](#)” If you have the time you will find a wealth of information and links for you to follow what is happening. I thank WSSDA for the information and encourage you to take the time to read! With all the McCleary / [HB 2242](#) “fix” proposals to be heard in hearings this week there is a lot going on.

Within all that is happening Career and Technical Education (CTE) is by no means forgotten in the discussions as demonstrated by the large number of related and specific CTE bills currently in the mix – you can find those highlighted in **yellow** throughout the WOVE.

Monday this week in House Education Committee will be a hearing two bills [HB 2685](#): Promoting pre-apprenticeship opportunities for high school students and [HB 2686](#): Concerning high school and beyond plans. We will be testifying in support of both bills, in [HB 2685](#) we will ask that registered youth apprenticeships be included, if not already, within the language and title of the bill.

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### **HOUSE BILLS**

**[HB 1254](#)**: Establishing a competitive educational grant program to promote confidence, public speaking, and leadership skills in students.

Substitute requires the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, subject to the appropriation of specific funding, to establish a temporary pilot project grant program to award grants to two school districts for the promotion of confidence, public speaking, and leadership skills in students in grades 2 through 5.

**[HB 1293](#)**: Concerning witnessing a student's college bound scholarship pledge when efforts to obtain a parent's or guardian's signature are unsuccessful.

**[HB 1377](#)**: Improving students' mental health by enhancing non-academic professional services.

**[HB 1439](#)**: Regulating the institutions of higher education, including for-profit institutions and private vocational schools, to protect students from unfair business practices.

**[HB 1453](#)**: Promoting agriculture science education in schools.

Substitute establishes the Work-Integrated Learning Initiative (Initiative) to promote work-integrated learning experiences for students through programs at schools selected to participate in the Initiative.

**[HB 1827](#)**: Relating to expanding the current and future educator workforce supply through evidence-based strategies to improve and incentivize the recruitment and retention of highly effective educators, especially in high-need subject, grade-level, and geographic areas, and to establish a cohesive continuum of high quality professional learning from preparation programs to job embedded induction, mentoring, collaboration, and other professional development opportunities.

**[HB 2266](#)**: Clarifying the nature of the driver training education curriculum developed and maintained by the Department of Licensing and Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

**HB 2275**: Creating the youth internship opportunity act.

## **SENATE BILLS**

**SB 5074**: Aligning eligibility for the college bound scholarship program with the state need grant program. Substitute aligns residency requirements for certain state financial aid programs. Includes individuals granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status, if they meet other statutory requirements, under the term resident student.

**SB 5141**: Concerning the regulation of programs of yoga practice or instruction as private vocational schools.

**SB 5183:** Concerning Career and Technical Education funding.

**SB 5206:** Providing for Career and Technical Education opportunities for elementary school students.

**SB 5216:** Requiring the Superintendent of Public Instruction to develop an elective firearms safety and hunter education course for high school students.

**SB 5318:** Promoting agriculture science education in schools.

**SB 5487:** Allowing retired teachers to be employed as mentors.

**SB 5576:** Addressing compliance with apprenticeship utilization requirements.

**SB 5592:** Decoupling services and activities fees from tuition.

Substitute removes the requirement that increases in fees cannot exceed the percentage increase in student tuition fees for resident undergraduate students. Requires that any increase of the services and activities fees shall not exceed 4% per year. Removes the requirement that a percentage increase in student fees does not apply to the portion of the services and activity fee previously committed to the repayment of bonded debt.

**SB 5622:** Integrating career readiness standards and instruction into the program of basic education.

**SB 5668:** Expanding civics education in public schools.

**SB 5766:** Preventing harassment, intimidation, and bullying in public schools.

**SB 5833:** Addressing the minimum retirement allowance under the teachers' retirement system, plan 1.

**SB 5993:** Modifying collective bargaining law to authorize providing additional compensation to academic employees at community and technical colleges.

**SB 6003:** Concerning breakfast after the bell programs in certain public schools.

Amendment passed states that student consumption of breakfast after the bell is not part of the definition or funding of the program of basic education in the definition of instructional hours.

Amendment passed adds a section that directs the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction with the Department of Agriculture to promote and facilitate new and existing regional markets programs, including farm-to-school initiatives and small farm direct marketing assistance, subject to appropriations. Revises language stating that breakfast after the bell programs are not included within the state's obligation for basic education funding. Removes a null and void clause.

**SB 6029:** Establishing a student loan bill of rights.

Substitute establishes a Student Education Loan Advocate (Advocate) to assist student education loan borrowers (borrowers), compile data, provide information on student education loans, and receive, review, and take action on complaints from borrowers. Requires student education loan servicers (servicers) to obtain a license from the Department of Financial Institutions (DFI) to operate in the state, and authorizes the DFI to establish fees.

Substitute establishes the Evergreen Free College Program to provide free college tuition and fees to eligible residents seeking a bachelor's degree, associate's degree, or certificate from a state institution of higher education.

**SB 6119**: Authorizing community and technical colleges to establish a police force on their campuses.

**SB 6121**: Siting of institutions of higher education and accompanying facilities.

**SB 6131**: Providing a tuition waiver for state residents who are members of a federally recognized Indian tribe.

**SB 6132**: Modifying provisions on second grade reading assessments.

February 2, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) in house of origin, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 6, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.
February 14, 2018	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
February 23, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 26, 2018	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 2, 2018*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 8, 2018	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
* After the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.
