# Career and Technical Education (CTE) this week in Olympia:

This has been the week where bills must have been passed out of their assigned policy committee and get moved on to either the "money" committees (Ways & Means or Appropriations) or the Rules committee.

Our bills of focus are either helping CTE funding in the final outcome or any policy bill that improves equity and access to CTE programs in their local school districts.

All of the funding bills that are currently in the works have some acknowledgement of CTE funding that increases funding in some way, shape, or form. The Senate passed a bill (<u>SB 5607</u>), which "throws out" the prototypical funding formula we currently use. There are still a lot of "ifs" because of the major shift in how schools will be funded; if this is additive then the \$500 per pupil has the potential to create the operational funding that CTE needs to thrive.

The House bill funding education passed this week uses the prototypical formula and modifies the CTE and skill center staffing ratio to provide additional funding.

Our original funding bill (<u>SB 5183</u>) is still in the mix, which increases MSOC for CTE and skill centers, reduces indirects, and creates guidance for allowable expenditures. This bill is still in the mix and driving the conversation about CTE funding within the other funding bills.

Along with funding is access to CTE by students. Two bills that directly address have major limiting factors of required testing linked graduation and the number of credits a student is required to earn. <u>HB 1046</u> is in Rules, which delinks the state testing from graduation and <u>HB 1509</u> caps the required credits needed for graduation at 21 with the opportunity for 24.

**ESHB 1843** – Substitute replaces the state K-12 salary allocation model with minimum statewide average salaries for each of the three state-funded staffing categories, and specifies the state operating budget bill must specify the basis for regional adjustments, beginning in school year 2017-2018 and phased in over three years. Increases prototypical school allocations for parent involvement coordinators and guidance counselors, beginning in school year 2018-2019 and phased in over two years. Increases vocational education funding by reducing class sizes for Career and Technical Education and skills centers, beginning in school year 2018-2019 and phased in over two years. Increases the statefunded instructional hours for the Learning Assistance, Highly Capable, and Transitional Bilingual Instructional programs, beginning in school year 2018-2019 and phased in over two years to the formulas for calculating school districts' maximum maintenance and operation levy authority and corresponding local effort assistance.

Amendment passed - Districts may receive funding allocated for K-3 class size only to the extent of, and in proportion to, the district's actual demonstrated K-3 class size reduction. If due to capital facilities needs a district cannot reduce actual class size in K-3, it may receive class size reduction funding if the funding is used for classroom-based staff who provide direct services to students. Districts receiving this funding must report on use of the funding, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction must adopt rules to implement the requirement.

February 24, 2017	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.
March 8, 2017	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
March 29, 2017	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 4, 2017	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 12, 2017*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
April 23, 2017	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.

\* After the 94th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.

Concerning school safety drills. Rep. Pettigrew Status: House 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading

# <u>HB 1284</u>

Requiring creation of a statewide school emergency panic button program. Rep. Lovick Status: House Education Bill failed to make the cutoff date. This does not mean it is "dead," but in all likelihood, it will not get further consideration.

# SHB 1293

Concerning witnessing a student's college bound scholarship pledge when efforts to obtain a parent's or guardian's signature are unsuccessful. Rep. Ortiz-Self Status: House 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading

# <u>HB 1294</u>

Requiring development of a model ethnic studies curriculum. Rep. Ortiz-Self Status: House Rules R

# <u>HB 1295</u>
