School uses AP materials in standard courses

Educators at a Washington high school are increasing the rigor of some standard courses by incorporating coursework similar to their Advanced Placement counterparts. Principal Matt Johnson said that by raising the bar in all courses, more students may be encouraged to take advanced courses and prepare for college-level work.

Program preps students for forestry careers

Middle- and high-school students in a Washington state school district are learning about career opportunities in the forestry industry through a new natural resources program. The program includes in-class lessons on trees and plants as well as weekly outdoor lessons.

Wash. students participate in career fair

More than 200 students from two Washington school districts participated in a career fair that featured 70 college, career and technical representatives as well as members of the US Army and Navy. The event was sponsored by Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs -- or GEAR UP -- a US Department of Education grant program.

Health system offers \$10K bonuses for full-time nurses

Samaritan Healthcare in Moses Lake, Wash., is paying a \$10,000 signing bonus for nurses who agree to work full-time for at least two years and a \$5,000 incentive for those who are hired for part-time work. CEO Teresa Sullivan said when compared with hiring temporary workers, it is better to improve and retain current staff.

College preps students for in-demand careers

Students at Everett Community College's Advanced Manufacturing Training and Education Center in Washington state are preparing for in-demand careers in the aerospace and manufacturing industries. Students enrolled earn certifications that build toward associate and other degrees.

Partnership to focus on health care workforce

Peninsula College in Washington state and regional health care providers are using \$1 million in state and private funding to increase the number of registered nurses and other practitioners in the North Olympic Peninsula. The program will include scholarships, clinical training, increased nursing-school enrollment and funding to hire more instructors.

District opens center for CTE

A Washington state school district is opening a new Career and Technical Education Center, where students will learn skills needed for various career. Officials say the district's CTE programs help to improve student outcomes, including graduation rates.

Wash. students work as apprentices

High-school students in Washington state are gaining first-hand experience through apprenticeships as part of the state's Aerospace Joint Apprenticeship Committee program. Manufacturers say the program is a key part of their plans to identify and recruit skilled workers.
