Last week, the third week of the legislative session, was a rather calm week for items related to Career and Technical Education (CTE) while bills relating to changes in education policy have the potential to increase awareness and access for students interested in taking more CTE in their schedule; such as delinking testing from graduation requirements, more uniform and rigorous high school and beyond plans for all districts, and increasing Work Based Learning opportunities are making their way through the legislative process.

One bill that I would like to have you review and share your thoughts of how it will affect the ability of students to participate in our CTSO organizations is [HB 2311: Reducing barriers to student participation in extracurricular activities](#). I will have a meeting with the prime sponsor Rep. Bergquist to learn more and have a meeting with Rep. Harris, the sponsor of the amendment to specifically add CTSOs to the bill on Wednesday to learn more. I look forward to hearing from you.

Many of you know the CTSO state officers and their state advisors host the annual Civic Engagement Day each year in Olympia and it will take place again this year on February 15 beginning with a "pre-briefing" from 8-9 a.m. at the Hotel RL in Olympia (formally known as the Red Lion). The state officers will be manning displays during the day under the Dome on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. If you have CTSO students and advisors planning on attending and would like more information, I suggest they contact their state advisor or executive secretary for their organization.

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## **HOUSE BILLS**

### **HB 1169: Enacting the student opportunity, assistance, and relief act**

Substitute repeals multiple provisions allowing suspension of a professional license due to student loan default. Changes the judgment interest rate for unpaid private student loan debt to 2 percentage points above the prime rate, unless the judgment interest rate is specified in the contract.

### **HB 1433: Decoupling services and activities fees from tuition**

Substitute removes the provision tying the annual increase of service and activity fees to the percentage increase in student tuition fees for the four-year public institutions.

### **HB 1488: Expanding higher education opportunities for certain students**

Substitute allows students who meet the 1079 criteria to be eligible for the College Bound Scholarship program. Provides that students who have received Opportunity Scholarships may renew their scholarships by filing the Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WAFSA). Provides that, for the purposes of residency for in-state tuition, a person is not a "non-resident student" if the person: (1) has been granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival (DACA) status before, on, or after the effective date of the act, regardless of whether the person is no longer in DACA status due to the termination, suspension, or modification of the DACA program; (2) has U or T non-immigrant status with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS); (3) has been issued a work permit by the USCIS; or (4) is in deferred action status.

### **HB 1512: Expanding college bound scholarship eligibility**

Substitute expands a student's initial eligibility for the College Bound Scholarship (CBS) to the seventh and eighth grade, rather than just the seventh grade. Allows eligible students to sign a CBS pledge in the ninth grade or tenth grade, beginning in the 2018-19 academic year, if they were previously ineligible in the seventh or eighth grade as a Washington student..

### **HB 1618: Concerning family and community engagement coordinators**

The amendment replaces the term "parent involvement coordinator" with "family and community engagement coordinator" in the statute describing staffing enrichments to the program of basic education to achieve consistency in the school code; and moves the effective date forward by one year.

## SENATE BILLS

### SB 6121: Siting of institutions of higher education and accompanying facilities

Substitute allows counties planning under the Growth Management Act (GMA) to extend public facilities and utilities to small, private higher education institutions that are located in close proximity to an urban growth area.

### SB 6132: Modifying provisions on second grade reading assessments

Substitute eliminates the requirement for the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) to select reading passages to measure second grade student's oral reading. Maintains the requirement for school districts to annually assess second grade students' oral reading, and if a student is reading substantially below grade level assess the students' oral reading at least once more during the second grade.

### SB 6133: Expanding statewide career and technical education course equivalency options

Substitute changes the content areas in which Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses may be approved as equivalent to academic courses for the purposes of high school graduation.

### SB 6474: Creating a pilot project for tribal compact schools

### SB 6483: Revising education funding reform provisions to enhance uniformity, flexibility, and special education funding

February 14, 2018	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
February 23, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 26, 2018	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 2, 2018*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 8, 2018	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
