Implementation Updates

Apprenticeship Preparation Pilot Program (2SHB1013) will establish Washington State Apprenticeship Training Council (WSATC) state-recognized regional apprenticeship preparation pilot programs and extends the Work Integrated Learning Advisory Committee. Implementation of these pilot programs will include partnerships with regional Educational Service Districts (ESDs) who will have the responsibilities of managing grant applications, fiscal awards, and program evaluations. In the first round of 2023–24 implementation, Marysville School District and Federal Way Public Schools will receive directed grants as named pilots, and three additional pilots will be selected within ESD 101, ESD 112, and ESD 171.

SHB1658, High School Credit for Paid Work Experience, authorizes high school students age 16 and over to earn up to two elective credits through paid work experience when specific requirements are met. OSPI adopted <u>rules for the new legislation</u> and updated existing WACs related to work experience through <u>Cooperative Worksite Learning</u>. The revisions to the WACs effective on August 31, 2023, provide consistent guidance of credit opportunities for working students and identify calculations for funding these experiences. The Washington State School Directors Association (WSSDA) anticipates releasing model board policy before the end of the year to support implementation.

<u>HB1308</u> establishes an additional graduation pathway option of completing a performance-based learning experience. The State Board of Education (SBE) held a public hearing on the proposed rules on Tuesday November 14. The full proposed rules are <u>here</u> and a summary of the proposed rules is available <u>here</u>. The Board continued to accept feedback prior to the



Board's adoption of final rules in December. Feedback must be received by December 4 to be included in meeting materials.

CTE Department Updates

- The CTE Program Supervisor of Course Equivalency and CTE Pathways position closed on 11/15/23. The agency looks forward to a productive hiring process and keeping the field updated on staffing additions.
