Quality Professional Development:

The Washington ACTE...

- 2019 Annual Career and Technical Education Summer Professional Development Conference in cooperation with OSPI and the WTECB supported learning for 762 paid registrations.
- 2019 Washington ACTE Fall STEM Conference supported STEM learning for 228 registered attendees.
- Continued to offer targeted learning and conference support to increase section/association membership growth.
- Continued to nurture current and grow new network of partners and sponsors for Washington ACTE.
- Completely flipped our annual conference to all virtual with over 150+ sessions.
- Began a CTE Learns for Washington ACTE with much more here to come.

Advocacy and Promotion of Career and Technical Education:

The Washington ACTE...

- *At the close of the 2020 Legislative Session – COVID-19 set in. Thus, limiting most of our face-to-face advocacy work.*
- COVID-19 cancelled the National ACTE Legislative Policy Seminar in DC along with the Region V Conference.
- Worked with the Washington CTE Foundation board to promote innovation in CTE for students and educators – a new foundation website has been created with the aid of a Region V Mini Grant.
- Presented CTE opportunities to various education groups pre-COVID.

Advancement of Policy and Legislation:

The Washington ACTE...

- Successfully achieved \$700,000 additional dollars for CTSOs in the supplemental budget, to later be removed due to the economic impact on state revenue due to COVID-19.
- Participated with the Washington State Legislative Taskforce on Work Based Learning Activities meeting both in person and Zoom.
- Almost all new funding added to the supplemental budget was removed due to COVID-19 and anticipated revenue loss.
- WOVE support continued to support CTE supportive legislative members.

Continuous Quality Association Improvement:

The Washington ACTE...

- Ended 2019-2020 fiscal year with 1,821 Washington ACTE members and 387 ACTE members.
- The WITEA section ended the year with a 22% membership increase; WAAE, WSBEA, WA-CCER, WA-FACSE, and WASTS exceeded their retention goals for the year.
- Provided scholarships for a variety of opportunities:
 - \$200 travel scholarships for Career and Technical Student Organizations
 - \$1,000 for Teacher of the Year award
- Received the GOLD Quality Association Standards Award from the national ACTE for the 20th year in a row, which represents the highest standard for an ACTE state association in the national ACTE.
- Flipped the Washington ACTE summer and fall conferences to fully virtual for growth and continued career professional development for members.
- Provided assistance to sections asking for help in “flipping” their conferences to virtual.
