Administrator of the Year

The Washington ACTE Administrator of the Year Award recognizes administrative CTE professionals at the school, district, county, or state level who have demonstrated leadership in ensuring teacher and student success and have made significant contributions toward innovative, unique, and effective Career and Technical Education programs.

Helping students find their futures is Lynn's true passion. Serving as a CTE Director in the Aberdeen School District for the past 22 years. Lynn has used her skills to help others navigate exploration opportunities and experiences. After receiving a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration and a Master's Degree in Business Management in the early 1990's, Lynn served on a local advisory committee for business education programs. She was working in the manufacturing field and not really finding satisfaction with her work. The connection to CTE drew her in right away, led her to a true interest and she pursued a Master's in Teaching degree along with CTE certification.
