WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education

2024 Legislative Session | January 26, 2024

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Week three of the legislative session brought a feverish pace as we race towards the first milestone – policy committee cutoff. Wednesday, January 31 marks the day where bills have to be voted out of their policy committee in order to advance and stay "alive" this session. This only includes "policy" bills that do not require taxpayer dollars to implement. Fiscal bills have a longer timeline as they will be cutoff on February 5. This week also happens to be the Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSO) legislative days. CTE student leaders participate in a training session Thursday night and will be around the capitol campus all day Friday, January 26. The CTSOs come to the capitol this time each year to spread awareness about their programs and advocate for any timely causes that might be appropriate and meet their local elected representatives.

Bill Highlights

HB 2236 - Expanding and strengthening career and technical education core plus programs - This bill was passed out of committee with a party line vote as a Proposed Substitute, which means a "whole" new bill was written to include the variety of proposed amendments in a single comprehensive amendment. You can find a summary of the changes and the new bill language in PSHB 2236. Now the bill moves to House Appropriations for their consideration. How soon this will happen depends on how fast a Fiscal Report on the bill can be provided to the committee.

HB 2018 - Improving student outcomes by restricting mobile device use by public school students - This bill requires OSPI to select pilot sites to implement a strategy to restrict student mobile device use during instructional hours and to report to the OSPI with certain information related to implementing the restriction. It also charges OSPI to report to the Legislature with a summary of research on policies and procedures restricting student mobile device use during instructional hours and recommendations for successful restriction strategies. This bill appears to be on track to clear the 1/31 cutoff as it had a favorable hearing on January 23 and is scheduled for a vote on January 30.

<u>SB 5849 - An act relating to a computer science competency graduation requirement</u> - This bill has been on the bill watchlist since it dropped in the pre-session. On January 25 this bill was amended in the Senate education committee with agreed upon language from the Chair, Senator Wellman. That new language can be seen here and was adopted by the committee.

HB 2406 - Establishing a work group to assess the restrictions on the employment of 16- and 17-year-olds - Representative April Connors of Kennewick introduced this bill, which establishes a work group for Preparatory CTE students and may potentially allow 16- and 17-year-olds to use the certification or license (CNA, HCA) they earned to accumulate work hours. The WA-ACTE legislative team met with Rep. Connors this week to engage on this policy proposal. This bill will ultimately become an interim work project to shore up the parameters and Rep. Connors assured us that WA-ACTE will be at the table for those discussions as that work group seeks to draft new legislation.
