# WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education

2020 Legislative Session | February 11, 2020

WOVE...Representing the Career and Technical Education field through advocacy activities, which promotes the value of CTE and the policies that are needed to support CTE practitioners, advance the field, and improve student learning.

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**Week Four...Today the 11<sup>th</sup>,** bills have to be out of fiscal committees and starts the run to get those bills through rules on to the floor and passed by the full chamber by Wednesday, February 19. Be sure and check out the upcoming hearing schedule and if you're coming to Olympia please feel free to reach out if we can help your efforts in any way.

# WA-ACTE Legislative Strategic Plan's three focus areas and related bills:

# **FOCUS: CTE RESOURCES (Funding):**

- For the <u>proposed improved language for CTE Resources</u> we will be working on our new approach for next year's session.
- The following two bills make changes to the prototypical funding formula that, if passed, will significantly affect CTE funding at skill centers, high schools, and middle schools:
  - o HB 2841 Concerning skill center class sizes.
    - Not on any calendar at this time.
  - SB 6615 Concerning staff funding for school districts.
    - Was heard in EL&K12 committee on 2/5 chair stated it will not be moving this session.

#### OTHER EDUCATION FUNDING BILLS:

- SB 6492, the fix for last year's HB 2158 Workforce Investment Act. The House approved that bill with 52 yes votes and goes directly to the governor and he is expected to sign it. Bills move quickly when there's motive, and there was with this piece of legislation. As a reminder, this is the bill that fixes the revenue streams for all the grants that HB 2158 produced, as well as a number of other things, including what was formerly called the state need grant. They repealed the tax that was implemented on 1/1/2020 and they reinstated an essentially broader but simpler B&O tax effective for April of this year. It will go into law and revenue can work with the businesses before April 2020. It produces more money than the previous revenue stream did. The previous revenue stream was only going to produce about 780 million, but a need of a billion dollars was projected over four years, and this new structure will exceed that billion dollars over four years.
- <u>SB 6505</u> was passed out of the Senate Education Committee this morning. It's a broad bill and turned into a little bit of a battle between OSPI, the primary advocate on the piece of legislation and the CTC system, which doesn't want to swallow all the costs associated with implementing the piece of legislation.
- The next revenue forecast is February 19 and is again supposed to be positive; i.e., we're going
  to be bringing in more money than projected and the legislature will have some additional
  resources to spend in their budget. Not clear at this point how much more, but the monthly
  reports the Department of Revenue have been positive.

#### **FOCUS: THE VALUE OF CTE:**

- <u>HB 2128</u> Establishing new reporting requirements for the delivery and improvement of Career and Technical Education.
  - February 7 Passed unanimously from House K-12 committee to House Rules Committee.
- HB 2663 Concerning maximum salaries for skill center certificated instructional staff training students to work in skill center identified high-demand fields, including as veterinary technicians, nursing or medical assistants, or cybersecurity specialists.
  - Not on any calendar at this time.
- SB 6374 Concerning apprenticeship materials for dual credit scholarship programs.
  - February 7 Passed to Rules Committee for second reading.

#### FOCUS: SUPPORT CTE STUDENT LEADERSHIP:

- <u>CTSO Funding Increase</u> for CTSO activity grant funds over time. Members have begun to submit budget request letters to the fiscal committees (Appropriations and Ways & Means) asking that increased funding be provided.
  - o If you would like to help with Senators and Representatives, please reach out and ask them to request and support an increase in funding for our 8 CTSOs.
- HB 1660 Extracurricular activity participation.
  - Scheduled for Executive Session 2/4

# ADVOCATING WITHIN THE PDC RULES AS A PUBLIC EMPLOYEE:

Always remember to advocate on your own time and only using your personal email.

Never use work resources to assure you do not violate PDC laws as a public employee.

 Review the week ahead committee meeting schedule below, focusing on bills that have been scheduled for public hearing that you have an interest in, then contact your legislators asking them to support bills that benefit CTE - especially if they serve on one of the committees where the bill has been assigned.

- Reach out with your perspective on the bill and share your story, consider contacting your member on a bill important to you, including bills not yet scheduled for hearings or on an issue, area of interest, or concern to you.
  - Share CTE program data from your school/district, stories, and suggestions
    to improve the proposed policy from your prospective is important to
    legislators. You are the expert for your program and the needs of your
    students so don't be anxious to share your story.
  - 2. Follow-up with legislators/committees on a specific bill or issue.

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#### **HOUSE BILLS**

#### HB 1891 - Concerning the use of Career and Technical Education resources.

No changes. This is the WA-ACTE request bill sponsored by Rep. Dave Paul. There has been a shift in strategy to implement to the effect of the bill. No anticipated action to be taken on this bill during the 2020 session.

# <u>HB 2128 - Establishing new reporting requirements for the delivery and improvement of Career and Technical Education.</u>

February 6 - Public hearing and executive action taken in the House Committee on Education.

February 7 - Passed unanimously from House K-12 Committee to House Rules Committee. Referred to Rules 2 Review.

#### **HB 2324 - Supplemental Capital Budget**

<u>January 14, 2020 - Public hearing in the House Committee on Capital Budget.</u> Like all three budget bills, the final product will be voted on a passed towards the end of session in March.

#### **HB 2325 - Supplemental Operating Budget**

<u>January 13, 2020 - Public hearing in the House Committee on Appropriations.</u> Like all three budget bills, the final product will be voted on a passed towards the end of session in March.

#### **SENATE BILLS**

#### SB 5803 - Concerning the use of Career and Technical Education resources.

No changes. This is the WA-ACTE request bill sponsored by Sen. Ann Rivers. There has been a shift in strategy to implement to the effect of the bill. No anticipated action to be taken on this bill during the 2020 session.

### SB 6124 - Establishing a statewide environmental sustainability education program.

<u>January 15, 2020 - Public hearing in the Senate Committee on Early Learning & K-12 Education.</u> No further action.

# SB 6374 - Concerning apprenticeship materials for dual credit scholarship programs.

February 6 - Executive action taken in the Senate Committee on Ways & Means.

February 7 - Passed unanimously from Senate Committee to Senate Rules Committee for second reading.

# SB 6615 - Concerning staff funding for school districts.

February 11, 2020	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.
February 19, 2020	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
February 28, 2020	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 2, 2020	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 6, 2020*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 12, 2020	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.

<sup>\*</sup> After 5:00 p.m. on the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.
