# WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education

2024 Legislative Session | February 16, 2024

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The teams have returned from the locker room, and we have started the second half of the legislative session. February 13 was the final day for bills to get off their respective floors, which turned Monday night into a marathon bill session as the public watched the house of representatives vote on bills until 2:31a.m. But, with that cutoff being passed the lawmakers are now able to go back to committee work and consider the remaining bills.

You will notice a larger-than-usual "upcoming events" section as the next week(s) of the legislature are the most important. Serious bills that made it to the second half will be heard at a feverish pace as the two bodies try to agree on what to pass and what to let expire by fate of the calendar.

On Monday, February 19 the Senate will hear <u>HB 2236</u> in Early Learning and K-12 Committee at 1:30 p.m. This will be the first policy committee in the Senate and given the 97-0-1 vote on the House floor, we expect a favorable hearing next week in the Senate as well.

The first version of the capital budget was released on Thursday as lawmakers begin to see the numbers from the revenue forecast trickle in. The Senate delivered their capital spending document, which you can view <a href="here">here</a>. We expect to see the first version of the operating budgets on February 20 and the House of Representatives will hear the first version of the operating budget on February 21 at 4:00 p.m.

### 2024 Session Cutoff Calendar

February 21, 2024	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 26, 2024	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 1, 2024*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 7, 2024	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.

<sup>\*</sup> After 5:00pm on the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.
