WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education

2024 Legislative Session | February 2, 2024

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The first of many milestones was reached this week when the policy committee cutoff came and went. The first sifting of bills is the longest stretch of the session followed by a fury of cutoff dates that lead to the March 8 adjournment.

This weekend the fiscal committees will be working to consider all recently passed policy bills that made it through the aforementioned cutoff date. As the legislature begins to move towards a fiscal frame of mind, the policy bills with fiscal ramifications begin to build the operating budget bill document. Fiscal policy that gets passed ahead of the budget has to be incorporated into the agreed upon operating budget.

The final piece of the budget puzzle is the revenue forecast. In even numbered years the revenue forecast comes out on February 20 and in odd years it is delivered on March 20. These dates give lawmakers the ability to integrate timely budget data into their final bill. As a reminder, Washington State has a balanced budget mandate so we cannot spend into deficit. Our biennial budgets have to balance over a four-year outlook based on the non-partisan budget forecast data.

Bill Highlights

<u>HB 2236 - Expanding and strengthening career and technical education core plus programs</u> - This bill we have been engaging stakeholders in was heard in House Appropriations committee on February 1 and is now scheduled to be voted out of committee on Saturday, February 3. Amendments are still being offered and we aren't completely sure what the final language will be coming out of the House, but opposition out of testimony was not a deal breaker. We look forward to seeing this bill go across the rotunda for the second half of session.

<u>SB 6002 - Transferring the professional educator standards board and the paraeducator board to the office of the superintendent of public instruction</u>

<u>SB 6003 - Concerning the superintendent of public instruction chairing and administering the state</u> <u>board of education</u> Both of these policies, sponsored by Thurston County Senator Sam Hunt, missed the policy cutoff deadline and will be considered dead for the remainder of the session. The WA-ACTE did not engage on these as there was very little action from the beginning of session, although many in the education community supported this action.

2024 Session Cutoff Calendar

February 5, 2024	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.			
February 13, 2024 Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).				
February 21, 2024	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.			
February 26, 2024	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.			
March 1, 2024*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).			
March 7, 2024	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.			

* After 5:00pm on the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.
