

WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education

2019 Legislative Session | February 4, 2019

**WOVE...Representing the Career and Technical Education field through advocacy activities, which promotes the value of CTE and the policies that are needed to support CTE practitioners, advance the field, and improve student learning.
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At the start of week four of the legislative session we have been able to stand up two bills to bring our proposal to achieve solution number one in our Legislative Action Plan and our policy brief ([Resources for CTE Programs](#)) concerning the use of Career and Technical Education resources.

We are excited to announce that we have [HB 1891](#) - "Concerning the use of career and technical education resources." Sponsored by Rep. Paul (D-10th LD), Rep. McCaslin (R-4th LD), and Rep. Berquist (D-11th LD) in the House. Referred to [Appropriations Committee](#). And [SB 5803](#) - "Concerning the use of career and technical education resources." Sponsored by Sen. Rivers (R-18th LD), Sen. Rolfes (D-23rd LD), Sen. Walsh (R-16th LD), Sen. Takko (D-19th LD), Sen. Warnick (R-13th LD), Sen. Zieger (R-25th LD), Sen. Palumbo (D-1st LD), and Sen. Schoesler (R-9th LD). Referred to [Early Learning & K12 Education Committee](#).

It is important to know that these two bills are not considered "companion" bills due to the slight difference in language used to achieve the same end. Check them out and let us know which you may prefer.

Now starts the long tenacious work to get these bills through the legislative process to final passage, stay tuned to the WOVE for how you can help along each step to final passage. As you can see each bill has been referred to a committee for a public hearing before the committee can take action to pass it to the next committee that needs to approve before it goes to the floor for a vote.

What we need from you all in the next few days is to contact (email or call) the chair of both the Appropriations and Early Learning & K12 Education Committee, Rep. Ormsby (D-3rd LD Timm.Ormsby@leg.wa.gov) and Sen. Wellman (41st LD Lisa.Wellman@leg.wa.gov) and ask that they hold a hearing on the bill before their committee cutoff. THIS IS CRITICAL TO HAVE HAPPEN! Without the chair scheduling a hearing and then an executive session to move the bill out of committee - the bills will die in committee. Ask for help from your advisory committees, parents, and students when and how appropriate - using care not to use public resources and contracted time to do so!

If you're interested in being more engaged in making this happen and to help our work on these bills, please join us for our weekly GoToMeetings every Thursday at 6 PM - just let me know and I will send you the details to join us.

Along with our members' support we will reach out to education lobbyists from groups that have and continue to support CTE with the bill numbers for them to support so that they, like you, can advocate for the bills along the way.

Hopefully you are motivated to engaged in actions to support our CTE advocacy efforts, so here are some actions you may consider taking: Always remember to advocate on your own time and only using your personal email. Never use work resources to be assured that you do not violate PDC laws as a public employee.

- Review the week ahead committee meeting schedule, focusing on bills that have been scheduled for public hearing, and contact your legislators asking them to support our two CTE bills - especially if they serve on one of the key committees.
- Reach out with your perspective on the bill and share your story, consider coming to Olympia to meet with your member, and testify on a bill important to you.
- Share CTE program data from your school/district, stories, and suggestions to improve the proposed policy from your prospective is important to legislators. *You are the expert for your program and the needs of your students so don't be anxious to share your story.*
- Follow-up with legislators/committees on a specific bill or issue.
- Provide input on bills not yet scheduled for hearings that are an issue area of interest or concern to you. Specifically, for CTE share your thoughts on HB 1891 & SB 5803.

January 14, 2019	First Day of Session
February 22, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) in house of origin, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 1, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.
March 13, 2019	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
April 3, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 9, 2019	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 17, 2019*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
April 28, 2019	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
