This week's update:

Today is day 43 of the Legislative Session. Friday, February 22 marked the [first major milestone](#) in the 105-day Legislative Session: the first policy cutoff. In order for a bill to continue moving through the process, it had to be passed out of its policy committee by 5 p.m. and on to its next stop either to the appropriate fiscal committee or to the Rules committee to be scheduled for floor debate. [SB 5803](#) our CTE Resources bill in the Senate suffered that fate of not making the policy cutoff. Senate Early Learning and K-12 Education Committee heard the bill last Wednesday but failed to "exec" the bill out of committee. We continue work on [HB 1891](#) CTE Resources bill in the House to have it heard in Appropriations before the fiscal cutoff of March 1. While this bill does not require any new funding from the state, it does outline the allowable uses of the enhanced portion of the CTE Running Start Rate, which is \$924.38 per 1.0 CTE-AAFTE. This is 10.20% of the total statewide funding for CTE.

All things Budget:

While anticipated state revenues appear to be higher than expected as outlined in last week's [monthly revenue update](#), planned and proposed spending is also much higher - much more than expected revenues. This not good news for the hundreds of proposals totaling billions of dollars. Luckily our CTE Resources bill does not create new spending, other than caseload increase and inflation. As the next [revenue forecast](#) is expected on March 20 and the House's proposed budget will be released shortly thereafter, leadership in the House and Senate clearly have a lot to wrestle with in the remaining days of the session.

House Majority Leader Pat Sullivan also shared [a handout](#) that was presented early-on in the session in the [House Appropriations Committee](#) regarding the operating budget and the four-year outlook. The full PowerPoint [presentation](#) (thanks to WSSDA for sharing) by non-partisan committee staff provides an overview of the Legislature's state and federal budgetary requirements (constitutional and statutory), and where they have discretion in slides 11-13. The revenue/spending outlook for the 2019-21 biennium, including explanation regarding the 1-year infusion of funding for K-12 salaries and implications of other requirements related to K-12 funding moving forward to slides 18-19. It is important to note that this presentation was made prior to last week's [monthly revenue update](#) released by the Economic & Revenue Forecast Council, indicating tax collections being \$153.6M over the November forecast.

Taking Action:

Hopefully you are engaged in actions to support our CTE advocacy efforts, so here are some actions you may consider taking. *Always remember to advocate on your own time and only using your personal email. Never use work resources to be assured that you do not violate PDC laws as a public employee.*

- Review the week ahead committee meeting schedule, focusing on bills still alive in the process that have been scheduled for public hearing, then contact your legislators asking them to support our two CTE bills—especially if they serve on one of the committees where the bill has been assigned.
- Reach out with your perspective on the bill and share your story, consider coming to Olympia to meet with your member, and testify on a bill important to you.
- Share CTE program data from your school/district, stories, and suggestions to improve the proposed policy from your prospective is important to legislators. *You are the expert for your program and the needs of your students so don't be anxious to share your story.*
- Follow-up with legislators/committees on a specific bill or issue.
- Provide input on bills not yet scheduled for hearings that are an issue or area of interest or concern to you.

SESSION CUTOFF CALENDAR

March 1, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.
March 13, 2019	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
April 3, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 9, 2019	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 17, 2019*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
April 28, 2019	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
<p>* After the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.</p>	

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
