## WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education



## 2018 Legislative Session | January 22, 2018

WOVE...Representing the Career and Technical Education field through advocacy activities, which promotes the value of CTE and the policies that are needed to support CTE practitioners, advance the field, and improve student learning.

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Monday marks the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 60-day session. While this is scheduled as a "short" session the volume of bills carried over from 2017 and new introductions is the opposite of "short" generating a very fast pace for members and staff. A key component of that hectic pace is the continued focus on "sorting out" completing of the policy and funding effect(s) of <u>HB 2242</u> passed at the end of the third special session last year.

In an effort to help you understand the depth of what <u>HB 2242</u> addressed and how our education partners are responding to the changes I am sharing "WSSDA's Legislative Update for Week 2 of the 2018 Legislative Session (January 15 - 21) is <u>now available here!</u> "If you have the time you will find a wealth of information and links for you to follow what is happening. I thank WSSDA for the information and encourage you to take the time to read! With all the McCleary / <u>HB 2242</u> "fix" proposals to be heard in hearings this week there is a lot going on.

Within all that is happening Career and Technical Education (CTE) is by no means forgotten in the discussions as demonstrated by the large number of related and specific CTE bills currently in the mix – you can find those highlighted in yellow throughout the WOVE.

Monday this week in House Education Committee will be a hearing two bills <u>HB 2685</u>: Promoting pre-apprenticeship opportunities for high school students and <u>HB 2686</u>: Concerning high school and beyond plans. We will be testifying in support of both bills, in <u>HB 2685</u> we will ask that registered youth apprenticeships be included, if not already, within the language and title of the bill.

#### **HOUSE BILLS**

<u>HB 1254</u>: Establishing a competitive educational grant program to promote confidence, public speaking, and leadership skills in students.

Substitute requires the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, subject to the appropriation of specific funding, to establish a temporary pilot project grant program to award grants to two school districts for the promotion of confidence, public speaking, and leadership skills in students in grades 2 through 5.

Substitute removes the requirement that increases in fees cannot exceed the percentage increase in student tuition fees for resident undergraduate students. Requires that any increase of the services and activities fees shall not exceed 4% per year. Removes the requirement that a percentage increase in student fees does not apply to the portion of the services and activity fee previously committed to the repayment of bonded debt.

Amendment passed states that student consumption of breakfast after the bell is not part of the definition or funding of the program of basic education in the definition of instructional hours.

Amendment passed adds a section that directs the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction with the Department of Agriculture to promote and facilitate new and existing regional markets programs, including farm-to-school initiatives and small farm direct marketing assistance, subject to appropriations. Revises language stating that breakfast after the bell programs are not included within the state's obligation for basic education funding. Removes a null and void clause.

Requires student education loan servicers (servicers) to obtain a license from the Department of Financial Institutions (DFI) to operate in the state, and authorizes the DFI to establish fees.

February 14, 2018	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
February 23, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 26, 2018	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 2, 2018*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 8, 2018	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
